

ANNUAL BLUE MASS FOR LAW ENFORCEMENT AND EMERGENCY/SAFETY OFFICIALS

WEDNESDAY, OCTOBER 2, AT 8:30 A.M.

The Diocese of Palm Beach will hold its Annual Blue Mass here at St. Ignatius to honor police, law enforcement, fire, other emergency and safety officials, as well as those who have fallen in the line of duty. The Mass is open to all active and retired law enforcement, safety officers and personnel from different local municipalities, federal, state and local jurisdictions within the five counties of the diocese. Those of all faiths are invited to attend. Families and those in the community who support these officers, fire and emergency officials are also invited.

The Mass is called a Blue Mass in recognition of the uniform officers wear. The Mass will begin with a procession of those who are being honored. Most Reverend Gerald M. Barbarito, Bishop of Palm Beach, will be the Celebrant. Following the Mass, refreshments will be served in the parish hall for all of those in attendance.

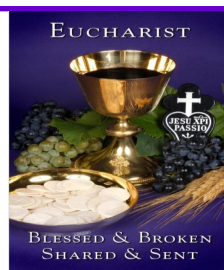

R.C.I.A. - THE RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION FOR ADULTS



Each year on Holy Saturday during the Easter Vigil, thousands are baptized into the Catholic Church in the United States. Parishes welcome these new Catholics through the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) What are the steps of RCIA? Prior to beginning the RCIA process, an individual comes to some knowledge of Jesus Christ, considers his or her relationship with Jesus


Christ and is usually attracted in some way to the Catholic Church. This period is known as the Period of Evangelization and Precatechumenate. For some, this process involves a long period of searching; for others, a shorter time. Often, contact with people of faith and a personal faith experience lead people to inquire about the Catholic Church. After a conversation with a priest, or RCIA director, the person, known as an "inquirer," may seek acceptance into the Order of Catechumens, through the Rite of Acceptance. During this Rite, the inquirer stands amidst the parish community and states that he or she wants to become a baptized member of the Catholic Church. The parish assembly affirms this desire and the inquirer becomes a Catechumen. **Our classes are held on Tuesday evenings at 7:00 p.m. in the Family Life Center. Our next meeting is Tuesday, October 1. If you're interested, please contact Deacon John Beaudoin in the parish office.**

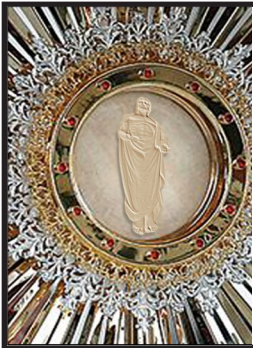

Knights of Columbus Catholic Citizenship Essay Contest



Theme: Discuss the meaning of Virtue and how you live and embody the virtue of Charity.

"Charity is the theological virtue which we love God above all things for his own sake, and our neighbor as ourselves for the love of God" - Catechism of the Catholic Church, 1822

Biblically, virtue is understood as the conformity of life and conduct with the principles of morality, while Charity signifies the reciprocal love between God and man, one that is manifest in unselfish love and eloquently shown in the life, teachings, and death of Jesus Christ. *"You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind. This is the great and first commandment. And a second is like it, you shall love your neighbor as yourself"* (Matthew 22:37-39).

In an essay of 500-750 words, consider the meaning of virtue and think about ways in which you exemplify the virtue of Charity to glorify and reflect the nature of God. This could be at home with your families or in your communities, as you enrich the welfare of others. There will be different prizes for different levels (Scholarships, gift certificates, plaques, trophies etc.) The top three international level winners for each grade will receive monetary awards: \$300 for 1st place, and \$100 each for two runner-up in each grade level. Checks are accompanied by a framed certificate. Teens interested within grades 8th – 12th, can contact Dee in the youth office for more information.
