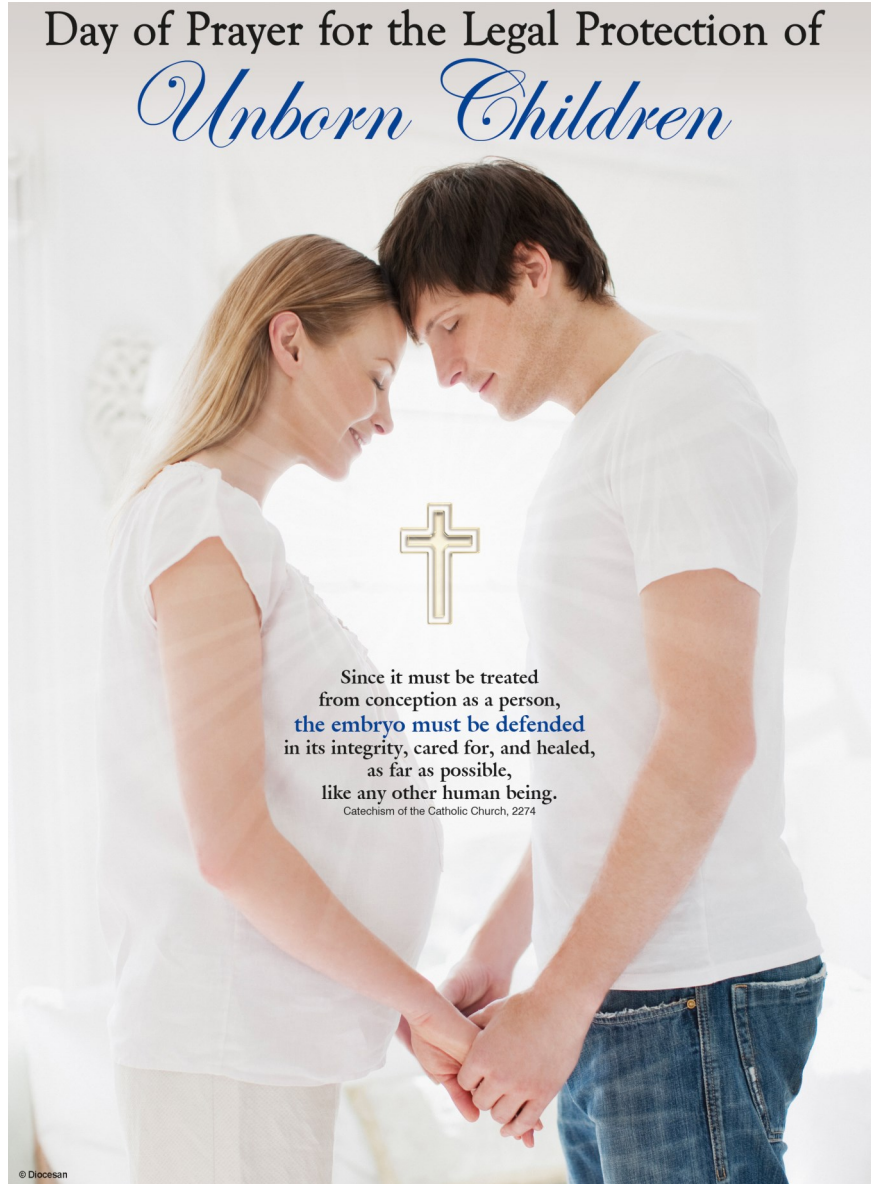

## **Renewed Call to a Culture of Life on the Tragic Anniversary of Roe v. Wade: A Statement of the Catholic Bishops of Florida**

January 22, 2020

Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of Unborn Children

January 22, 2020 marks a sad anniversary: the U.S. Supreme Court's tragic decision legalizing the deliberate taking of unborn human life through elective abortion. Judicial sanction of the termination of life in the womb seen by some as a "right" is a "wrong" that for 47 years has coarsened hearts and darkened minds. Today, after more than 60 million abortions, there is less regard for all human life as society discards those deemed inconvenient because of age, infirmity or any other reason.

This past year, in one of the most polarized political environments experienced in recent history, we were appalled that some states sought to strengthen laws that permit abortions even to the moment of birth. We also saw the U.S. Congress fail repeatedly to consider protections that ensure infants who survive abortion receive proper medical care.

Yet, amid this darkness, signs of hope remain, and good and courageous acts light a way forward. The passage of laws by several state legislatures to restrict abortion is encouraging. Wide support in Florida for the vital help provided to pregnant women and their families by pregnancy care centers is greatly welcomed. Parish and other ministries that provide material and spiritual help and offer hope and healing for those suffering from past abortions hearten us and are to be commended.

The prevailing interpretation of the privacy clause in our Florida constitution, which has provided broader rights to abortion than the U.S. Constitution, is frustrating. Nevertheless, we are hopeful that legislation requiring a 24-hour reflection period prior to an abortion will ultimately survive court challenges and be upheld as law. Despite the claims by some that Roe v. Wade is "settled law", Americans are still conflicted about abortion, and this is what lies behind much of the divisiveness of today's political discourse. As Catholics, we do not pretend to impose our views about human life on the citizenry of this great nation. Nevertheless, as Americans, we wish to contribute, as faithful and faith-filled citizens, to the common good and to promote human flourishing in our society by making our proposal. Dr. Martin Luther King's proposal on the need for racial justice touched the conscience of a nation and brought about the end of Jim Crow. In the same way, our proposal informed by Catholic teachings but accessible to reason hopes to touch consciences and bring an end to America's "slaughter of the innocents".

This proposal holds that everyone's human dignity is served when each human life is protected in law from the moment of conception until natural death. Respect for the right to life and dignity of every human person – whether he or she be poor, an immigrant, a refugee, incarcerated, infirmed, sick, elderly or unborn – simply reaffirms the self-evident truth that "all men are created equal" and "endowed by the Creator with certain unalienable rights" and thus promotes the "more perfect union" to which our founders aspired.

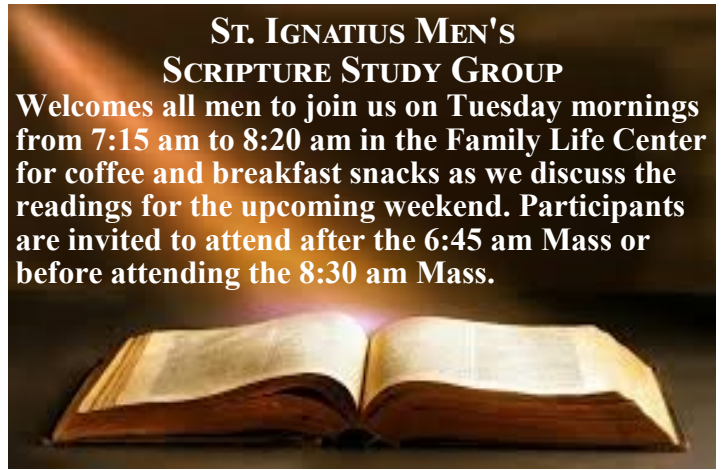

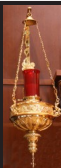

### Un Llamado Renovado a una Cultura de la Vida en el Trágico Aniversario de Roe V. Wade: Una Declaración de los Obispos Católicos de Florida

22 de enero de 2020

*Día de Oración por la Protección Legal de los Niños No Nacidos*

El 22 de enero de 2020 marca un triste aniversario: la trágica decisión de la Corte Suprema de los Estados Unidos para legalizar la toma deliberada de la vida humana por nacer mediante el aborto electivo. La sanción judicial para terminar la vida en el útero, vista por algunos como un “bien”, es un “mal” que durante 47 años ha endurecido los corazones y turbado las mentes. En la actualidad, después de más de 60 millones de abortos, hay menos consideración por toda la vida humana, ya que la sociedad descarta a quienes considera inconvenientes por edad, enfermedad o cualquier otra razón.

El año pasado, en uno de los entornos políticos más polarizados experimentados en la historia reciente, nos horrorizó que algunos estados trataran de reforzar las leyes que permiten los abortos hasta el momento del nacimiento. También vimos cómo el Congreso de los Estados Unidos fracasó repetidamente en considerar protecciones para garantizar que los bebés que sobrevivan al aborto reciban atención médica adecuada.

Sin embargo, en medio de esta oscuridad quedan signos de esperanza, y las acciones buenas y valientes iluminan el camino a seguir. La aprobación de leyes por parte de varias legislaturas estatales para restringir el aborto es alentadora. En Florida ha recibido buena acogida el amplio apoyo para la ayuda vital que brindan los centros de atención del embarazo a las mujeres embarazadas y sus familias. Los apostolados parroquiales y otros que ofrecen ayuda material y espiritual, además de esperanza y sanación para quienes sufren como consecuencia de pasados abortos, nos animan y deben ser elogiados.

La interpretación predominante de la cláusula de privacidad en nuestra constitución de Florida, que ha otorgado derechos más amplios al aborto que la Constitución de los EE.UU., es frustrante. Sin embargo, tenemos la esperanza de que la legislación que requiere un período de reflexión de 24 horas antes de un aborto sobreviva finalmente los desafíos judiciales y se defienda como ley.

A pesar de las afirmaciones de algunos de que *Roe v. Wade* es “jurisprudencia reiterada”, los estadounidenses todavía están en conflicto sobre el aborto, y esto es lo que subyace en gran parte de la división sobre el discurso político actual. Como católicos, no pretendemos imponer nuestros puntos de vista sobre la vida humana en la ciudadanía de esta gran nación. Sin embargo, como estadounidenses y ciudadanos fieles y llenos de fe, deseamos contribuir con el bien común y la promoción de la prosperidad humana en nuestra sociedad al presentar nuestra proposición. La propuesta del Dr. Martin Luther King sobre la necesidad de justicia racial conmovió la conciencia de una nación y marcó el fin de Jim Crow. Del mismo modo, nuestra propuesta, apoyada en las enseñanzas católicas pero accesible a la razón, espera llegar a las conciencias y poner fin a la “matanza de los inocentes” de los Estados Unidos.

Esta propuesta sostiene que la dignidad humana de todos se beneficia cuando cada vida humana está protegida por la ley desde el momento de la concepción hasta la muerte natural. El respeto por el derecho a la vida y la dignidad de toda persona humana —ya sea pobre, inmigrante, refugiada, encarcelada, enferma, anciana o no nacida— simplemente reafirma la verdad evidente de que “todos los hombres han sido creados iguales” y “dotados por su Creador de ciertos derechos inalienables”. De esta manera se fomenta la “unión más perfecta” a la que aspiraban nuestros fundadores.
